

Minutes of the Group Parish Council of Flixton, St Cross and St Margaret South Elmham for Monday 18th July 2022.

Meeting held at St Margaret South Elmham's Village Hall.

Cllr Warne said that he had been to the Flixton Quarry Liaison meeting on Thursday the 14th of July and that no Planning decision had been made on the Buck excavation as yet and that it would probably not be made until the end of August.

Cllr Mulhearn, reporting on the UK Power development at St Margaret South Elmham, informed the Council that Mrs Valery Smith had discovered newts in one of the trenches on her land being dug by UK Power. Until this situation has been investigated officially all work is halted.

Cllr Kidner stated that the oak tree needing attention at St Margaret South Elmham had been inspected by Norse and that he was awaiting their response as to what was to be done.

Cllr French Mullen stated that the light weld fencing to be put up near the bus shelter at St Cross had arrived but that it was not high enough to be effective so would have to be backed up by hedging. Cllr Sanderson has this in hand.

Cllr French Mullen said that the residents had made a good job of clearing the area.
